EARTH DAY IDEAS



Environmental Awareness Lunch Bags:

This project is a cost-free environmental awareness project in which students decorate paper lunch bags with environmental messages for Earth Day. This project can also be done with grocery bags and is one of the oldest and largest educational projects on the Internet. The Earth Day Groceries Project is managed online by Mark Ahiness, a third grade teacher at Arbor Heights Elementary School in Seattle, Washington.

Project Outline:

- Bring in or have students bring to class paper lunch bags.
- Allow students to decorate the lunch bags with environmental messages.
- Have students exchange lunch bags with students within the same, another classroom or even another school.
- Spread your environmental message by having students use these lunch bags on Earth Day.

“Wasteless” School Day:

On Earth Day, challenge students to recycle, reduce and reuse in order to not create any waste. Encourage using both sides of the paper and using reusable bags and containers for their lunch.

One week before Earth Day, weigh your classrooms garbage at the end of each day. On Earth Day, weigh your classrooms garbage again and see how well your class did. What percentage of waste did you save from throwing away?

Take a look at what did get thrown away and try to find a method of recycling, reducing, or reusing these types of waste.
